

A Summary of Evidence from the Evaluation of the Impact of the Funding 2017-18

September 2018

- Achievement and attainment for pupils with Pupil Premium funding at the end of **Key Stage 2** showed a number of positive results
 - Seven pupils were eligible and tracked from Key Stage 1, and **17 of their 24** scores for Reading, Writing and Maths were at the Expected Standard or above (71%)
 - **Seven of the eight pupils achieved the Expected Level at Reading (87.5%); 3 achieved Greater Depth (37.5 %)**
 - Four of eight achieved expected levels in SPAG (50%)
 - Six of the eight pupils achieved the Expected Level at Math (75%); 1 achieved Greater Depth (12.5%)
 - **Seven of the eight pupils achieved the Expected Level at Writing (87.5%); 2 achieved Greater Depth (25%)**
 - **Progress scores were positive for 5 of 8 pupils in Reading; 6 of 8 in Writing, and 3 of 8 in Maths**
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- **In Year 2, 4 pupils received pupil premium and 3 did not reach expected levels**
 - For Early Years, the one pupil eligible did not achieve a Good Level of Development

Summary

The results at end of key stages show that pupils have made increasing progress as they go through the school. In Early years and Key Stage 1, gaps are present. The money has been spent on in-class support as well as tutoring sessions for selected pupils. The school will be focusing on progress in maths this year following an analysis of whole school progress in this subject.
