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Dear Parent/Carer

During the school holiday we ask that you follow all the national guidance and we are including some helpful bullet points and web addresses below. By taking individual responsibility to follow this guidance or updates as they are announced, we can together manage a safe and secure return to education in the new year.

- ❖ If your child is unable to start the new term because of COVID-19 or any other illness please let us know in the normal way. School reopens 4th January 2021
- ❖ If your child lives in the same household as someone with coronavirus, your child must stay at home for 10 days from the first day the person with coronavirus had symptoms or had their test.
- ❖ If your child develops Symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared (or from the date they received a positive test result).
- ❖ COVID-19: guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk) has information for households with possible coronavirus infection including easy to read guides in a number of languages.
- ❖ Guidance for contacts of people with confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection who do not live with the person - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk) has information for contacts of people with confirmed coronavirus infection including an easy to read guide.
- ❖ If your family is need of support to help you through a period of isolation, please see the Norfolk Assistance Scheme www.justonenorfolk.nhs.uk
- ❖ Some residents are also entitled to a self-isolation support payment of £500.
- ❖ Please remember; there are three simple actions we must all do to keep on protecting each other.
1. Wash hands 2. Cover face 3. Make space

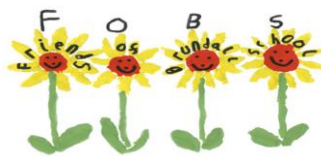
