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Dear Parents & Carers

This week has seen the new House Captains appointed to their roles. They did a wonderful job last Friday when they delivered their speeches to the school via Zoom, and we felt proud of every one of them as well as being in awe of their confidence and dedication.

On Wednesday 11th November, we marked Remembrance Day with a 2 minute silence throughout school. Mrs Wicks played the 'Last Post' and many of the children marked the day by making poppies in their classes and talking about why we remember this day. The feeling of unity within Brundall School during the 2 minutes was felt by school staff as we were able to mark this day as we would every year.

It has been pleasing to hear the positive comments from parents regarding the children's reports, which went home on Friday. We appreciate that parents have taken the time to feedback during this difficult time, and that there has been recognition of the amazing work happening in school by the children and our adults every day.

Since the change of guidance last week, we have been pleased to see that the majority of parents are following the rules and socially distancing on the school run. As a school, we have a duty to ensure the safety of children and adults, and we ask that we all work together to make this possible.
